²⁰ So he said to his daughters, "And where *is* he? Why *is* it *that* you have left the man? Call him, that he may ^xeat bread."

²¹Then Moses was content to live with the man, and he gave ^yZipporah his daughter to Moses. ²²And she bore *him* a son. He called his name ²Gershom,¹ for he said, "I have been ^a a ²stranger in a foreign land."

²³Now it happened ^b in the process of time that the king of Egypt died. Then the children of Israel ^cgroaned because of the bondage, and they cried out; and ^atheir cry came up to God because of the bondage. ²⁴So God ^eheard their groaning, and God ^f remembered His ^a covenant with Abraham, with Isaac, and with Jacob. ²⁵And God ^hlooked upon the children of Israel, and God ⁱacknowledged *them*.

MOSES AT THE BURNING BUSH

3 Now Moses was tending the flock of 'Jethro his father-in-law, "the priest of Midian. And he led the flock to the back of the desert, and came to 'Horeb, "the mountain of God. ²And "the Angel of the LORD appeared to him in a flame of fire from the midst of a bush. So he looked, and behold, the bush was not consumed. ³Then Moses said, "I will now turn aside and see this °great sight, why the bush does not burn."

4So when the LORD saw that he turned aside to look, God called ^pto him from the midst of the bush and said, "Moses, Moses!" And he said, "Here I am." ⁵Then He said, "Do not draw near this place. ⁹Take your sandals off your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground." ⁶Moreover He said, "I *am* the God of your father—the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." And Moses hid his face, for ^she was afraid to look upon God.

7And the LORD said: "I have surely seen the oppression of My people who are in Egypt, and have heard their cry "because of their taskmasters, ^v for I know their ³ sorrows. ⁸So ^wI have come down to ^xdeliver them out of the hand of the Egyptians, and to bring them up from that land ^yto a good and large land, to a land ^zflowing with milk and honey, to the place of "the Canaanites and the Hittites and the Amorites and the Perizzites and the Hivites and the Jebusites. 9Now therefore, behold, ^bthe cry of the children of Israel has come to Me, and I have also seen the ^coppression with which the Egyptians oppress them. ¹⁰ Come now, therefore, and I will send you to Pharaoh that you may bring My people, the children of Israel, out of Egypt."

^{II} But Moses said to God, ""Who *am* I that I should go to Pharaoh, and that I should bring the children of Israel out of Egypt?"

¹²So He said, ^f"I will certainly be with you. And this *shall be* a ^gsign to you that I have sent you: When you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall serve God on this mountain."

¹³Then Moses said to God, "Indeed, when I come to the children of Israel

and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they say to me, 'What *is* His name?' what shall I say to them?"

14And God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM." And He said, "Thus you shall say to the children of Israel, "I AM has sent me to you.' " 15 Moreover God said to Moses, "Thus you shall sav to the children of Israel: 'The LORD God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you. This is 'My name forever, and this is My memorial to all generations.' ¹⁶Go and ¹gather the elders of Israel together, and say to them, 'The LORD God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, of Isaac, and of Jacob, appeared to me, saying, "I have surely visited you and seen what is done to you in Egypt; ¹⁷ and I have said 'I will bring you up out of the affliction of Egypt to the land of the Canaanites and the Hittites and the Amorites and the Perizzites and the Hivites and the Jebusites, to a land flowing with milk and honey." ' 18 Then "they will heed your voice; and "you shall come, you and the elders of Israel, to the king of Egypt; and you shall say to him, 'The LORD God of the Hebrews has ° met with us; and now, please, let us go three days' journey into the wilderness, that we may sacrifice to the LORD our God.' 19 But I am sure that the king of Egypt ^{*p*} will not let you go, no, not even by a mighty hand. ²⁰So I will ⁹ stretch out My hand and strike Egypt with 'all My wonders which I will do in its midst; and ^safter that he will let you go. ²¹And ^tI will give this people favor in the sight of the Egyptians; and it shall be, when you go, that you shall not go empty-handed.

²²"But every woman shall ask of her neighbor, namely, of her who dwells near her house, ^varticles of silver, articles of gold, and clothing; and you shall put *them* on your sons and on your daughters. So "you shall plunder the Egyptians."

MIRACULOUS SIGNS FOR PHARAOH

4 Then Moses answered and said, "But suppose they will not believe me or listen to my voice; suppose they say, 'The LORD has not appeared to you.'"

²So the LORD said to him, "What is that in your hand?"

He said, "A rod."

³And He said, "Cast it on the ground." So he cast it on the ground, and it became a serpent; and Moses fled from it. ⁴Then the LORD said to Moses, "Reach out your hand and take *it* by the tail" (and he reached out his hand and caught it, and it became a rod in his hand), ⁵ "that they may ^xbelieve that the ^yLORD God of their fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has appeared to you."

⁶Furthermore the LORD said to him, "Now put your hand in your bosom." And he put his hand in his bosom, and when he took it out, behold, his hand was leprous, ^zlike snow. 7And He said, "Put your hand in your bosom again." So he put his hand in his bosom again, and drew it out of his bosom, and behold, ^ait was restored like his other flesh. 8 "Then it will be, if they do not believe you, nor heed the message of the ^{*b*} first sign, that they may believe the message of the latter sign. 9And it shall be, if they do not believe even these two signs, or listen to your voice, that you shall

take water from 'the river and pour *it* on the dry *land*. 'The water which you take from the river will become blood on the dry *land*."

¹⁰Then Moses said to the LORD, "O my Lord, I *am* not eloquent, neither before nor since You have spoken to Your servant; but ^{*d*}I *am* slow of speech and ²slow of tongue."

¹¹So the LORD said to him, ^e"Who has made man's mouth? Or who makes the mute, the deaf, the seeing, or the blind? *Have* not I, the LORD? ¹²Now therefore, go, and I will be ^fwith your mouth and teach you what you shall say."

¹³But he said, "O my Lord, ⁹please send by the hand of whomever *else* You may send."

¹⁴So ^hthe anger of the LORD was kindled against Moses, and He said: "Is not Aaron the Levite your brother? I know that he can speak well. And look, ^{*i*}he is also coming out to meet you. When he sees you, he will be glad in his heart. ¹⁵Now ^kyou shall speak to him and 'put the words in his mouth. And I will be with your mouth and with his mouth, and "I will teach you what you shall do. ¹⁶So he shall be your spokesman to the people. And he himself shall be as a mouth for you, and "you shall be to him as God. ¹⁷And you shall take this rod in your hand, with which you shall do the signs."

MOSES GOES TO EGYPT

¹⁸So Moses went and returned to ^oJethro his father-in-law, and said to him, "Please let me go and return to my brethren who *are* in Egypt, and see whether they are still alive." And Jethro said to Moses, ^{*p*} "Go in peace."

¹⁹Now the LORD said to Moses in ⁹Midian, "Go, return to 'Egypt; for ^sall the men who sought your life are dead." ²⁰Then Moses 'took his wife and his sons and set them on a donkey, and he returned to the land of Egypt. And Moses took "the rod of God in his hand.

²¹And the LORD said to Moses, "When you go back to Egypt, see that you do all those "wonders before Pharaoh which I have put in your hand. But "I will harden his heart, so that he will not let the people go. ²²Then you shall *say to Pharaoh, 'Thus says the LORD: "Israel *is* My son, ²My firstborn. ²³So I say to you, let My son go that he may serve Me. But if you refuse to let him go, indeed "I will kill your son, your firstborn." ""

²⁴And it came to pass on the way, at the ^bencampment, that the LORD ^cmet him and sought to ^dkill him. ²⁵Then ^eZipporah took ^fa sharp stone and cut off the foreskin of her son and ³cast *it* at ⁴Moses' feet, and said, "Surely you *are* a husband of blood to me!" ²⁶So He let him go. Then she said, "You are a ⁵husband of blood!"—because of the circumcision.

²⁷And the LORD said to Aaron, "Go into the wilderness ⁹to meet Moses." So he went and met him on ^hthe mountain of God, and kissed him.
²⁸So Moses ⁱtold Aaron all the words of the LORD who had sent him, and all the ^jsigns which He had commanded him. ²⁹Then Moses and Aaron ^kwent and gathered together all the elders of

saves Israel, though it be in Jonathan my son, he shall surely die." But not a man among all the people answered him. ⁴⁰Then he said to all Israel, "You be on one side, and my son Jonathan and I will be on the other side."

And the people said to Saul, "Do what seems good to you."

⁴¹Therefore Saul said to the LORD God of Israel, ""Give' a perfect *lot.*" *So Saul and Jonathan were taken, but the people escaped. ⁴²And Saul said, "Cast *lots* between my son Jonathan and me." So Jonathan was taken. ⁴³Then Saul said to Jonathan, ""Tell me what you have done."

And Jonathan told him, and said, ^z"I only tasted a little honey with the end of the rod that *was* in my hand. So now I must die!"

44 Saul answered, ^a"God do so and more also; ^b for you shall surely die, Jonathan."

⁴⁵But the people said to Saul, "Shall Jonathan die, who has accomplished this great deliverance in Israel? Certainly not! 'As the LORD lives, not one hair of his head shall fall to the ground, for he has worked "with God this day." So the people rescued Jonathan, and he did not die.

⁴⁶Then Saul returned from pursuing the Philistines, and the Philistines went to their own place.

SAUL'S CONTINUING WARS

47 So Saul established his sovereignty over Israel, and fought against all his enemies on every side, against Moab, against the people of ^eAmmon, against Edom, against the kings of ^fZobah, and against the Philistines. Wherever he turned, he ²harassed *them*. ⁴⁸And he gathered an army and ^gattacked³ the Amalekites, and delivered Israel from the hands of those who plundered them.

49^hThe sons of Saul were Jonathan, ⁴Jishui, and Malchishua. And the names of his two daughters *were these*: the name of the firstborn Merab, and the name of the youngerⁱMichal. **50** The name of Saul's wife *was* Ahinoam the daughter of Ahimaaz. And the name of the commander of his army *was* Abner the son of Ner, Saul's ⁱuncle. **51**^kKish *was* the father of Saul, and Ner the father of Abner *was* the son of Abiel.

⁵²Now there was fierce war with the Philistines all the days of Saul. And when Saul saw any strong man or any valiant man, 'he took him for himself.

SAUL SPARES KING AGAG

15 Samuel also said to Saul, ""The LORD sent me to anoint you king over His people, over Israel. Now therefore, heed the voice of the words of the LORD. ²Thus says the LORD of hosts: 'I will punish Amalek *for* what he did to Israel, "how he ambushed him on the way when he came up from Egypt. ³Now go and °attack⁵ Amalek, and "utterly destroy all that they have, and do not spare them. But kill both man and woman, infant and nursing child, ox and sheep, camel and donkey.'"

4 So Saul gathered the people together and numbered them in Telaim, two hundred thousand foot soldiers and ten thousand men of Judah. 5 And Saul came to a city of Amalek, and lay in wait in the valley.

I have performed the commandment of the LORD."

14 But Samuel said, "What then is this bleating of the sheep in my ears, and the lowing of the oxen which I hear?"

And did not the LORD anoint you king over Israel? ¹⁸Now the LORD sent you on a mission, and said, 'Go, and utterly destroy the sinners, the Amalekites, and fight against them until they are ¹consumed.' ¹⁹Why then did you not obey the voice of the LORD? Why did you swoop down on the ²spoil, and do evil in the sight of the LORD?"

²⁰And Saul said to Samuel, ^h"But I have obeved the voice of the LORD, and gone on the mission on which the LORD sent me, and brought back Agag king of Amalek; I have utterly destroyed the Amalekites. ²¹ⁱBut the people took of the plunder, sheep and oxen, the best of the things which should have been utterly destroyed, to sacrifice to the LORD your God in Gilgal."

²² So Samuel said:

²⁶ But Samuel said to Saul, "I will not return with you, °for you have rejected the word of the LORD, and the LORD has rejected you from being king over Israel."

³⁰Then he said, "I have sinned; *yet* ^shonor me now, please, before the elders of my people and before Israel, and return with me, that I may worship the LORD your God." ³¹So Samuel turned back after Saul, and Saul worshiped the LORD.

32Then Samuel said, "Bring Agag king of the Amalekites here to me." So Agag came to him cautiously.

And Agag said, "Surely the bitterness of death is past."

³³But Samuel said, ^t"As your sword has made women childless, so shall

³⁴Then Samuel went to "Ramah, and Saul went up to his house at 'Gibeah of Saul. ³⁵And "Samuel went no more to see Saul until the day of his death. Nevertheless Samuel mourned for Saul, and the LORD regretted that He had made Saul king over Israel.

JESUS IS LORD OF THE SABBATH
